

Below is the amount of donation along with a brief description of who and how the organization uses the donations.

- Children & Families of Iowa—\$500

 Is dedicated to improving the lives of children and families throughout Iowa with services ranging from family support to childcare to career training, behavioral health and more.
- IA Gold Star Military Museum—\$500

 The Museum's purpose is to collect, preserve and exhibit materials that illustrate the story of Iowa's military past from statehood to the present. The Iowa Gold Star Museum honors the heroic service of all Iowa veterans. Located at Camp Dodge in Johnston.

• Save a Warrior—\$500

Is dedicated to the prevention of veteran suicide and the preservation of life through the development and implementation of a groundbreaking, comprehensive program at our non-profit organization

West Region NCCC Scholarship—\$500

Annual scholarships awarded to members, children, and grandchildren of West Region members who are enrolled in any post high school education programs—see Governor Report for additional information.

- Richard K Mathern Automotive Sciences Scholarship- \$500 Established in remembrance of Dick Mathern, a longtime member of CCI. The endowed scholarship awards a \$1,000 scholarship annually to a DMACC student who is enrolled on a fulltime basis in any of DMACC's automotive or diesel programs
- Toys for Tots—\$750
 Is to collect new unwrapped toys and distribute toys to less fortunate children at Christmas.

• **St. Jude—\$1,000**Is leading the way the world understands, treats and defeats childhood cancer and other life-threatening diseases.

For \$15.00 you can purchase a number that is exclusively yours for the entire competition year. No other competitor can use that number at a WR sanctioned event in 2024. Below is the application form for a permanent number. The program is administered by the WR Treasurer, Linda Hommer.

100% of the funds generated by the WR permanent program are used to fund the WR Scholarship program. Annually, the WR awards scholarships to members, children, and grandchildren of WR members who are enrolled in post high school education programs. COMPETITION EVENT NUMBERS

Per current West Region Operating Rules and Procedures, the West Region will again administer a program under which "permanent" animant numbers may be assigned to those competitors who desire a "permanent" regional entrant number for the current competition year. Competitors must be current NCCC members. Requests for a "permanent" number will be administered as follows:

- From January 15th through February 15th you may request the same "permanent" number you
 had the previous year. You have priority.
- After February 15th, you may request a number with the understanding that numbers will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis. Linda Hommer, assigned by the West Region Competition Director, will be collecting your application and fees.
- Entrants must send their request form for a number assignment to Linda Hommer no earlier than
 January 15, 2024. Each club Governor should provide the proper form (included) to his/her members.
- 4 Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) in cash or check must accompany each request.
- The numbers 1 through 999 shall be available for assignment.
- 6. Numbers shall be assigned by the RCD, or his designee, as requested on an annual basis following receipt of all requests postmarked as per Items 1, 2 and 3 above. Members who held a "permanent" number from the previous year will be granted priority to that same number upon receipt of the proper form and fee if received in the January 15th to February 15th time period. NCCC membership must be maintained.
- 7. In case of more than one request for the same number, the following procedure will be used: First choice will go to the earliest postmark (but no earlier than January 15th). In the case of a request for the same number postmarked on the same day, the RCD will conduct a random drawing.
- No later than March 15th, the RCD or his designee will send a confirmation email to each NCCC
 member who requested a "permanent" number and a list of all currently assigned "permanent" numbers
 to each Governor of the West Region.

WEST REGION SCHOLARSHIP

Requirements/Rules of the Scholarship

The WR Scholarship will be given for the purpose of assisting a person with an WR affiliation in the continuation of his/her formal education. Any continuing education program is acceptable – any school or any college having any curriculum. However, some preference will be given to high school seniors and recent high school graduates who wish to attend college. The period of the award will be for one year, and previous award winners will be eligible.

No financial need requirement is to be established.

The Applicant

The applicant for the WR Scholarship must meet the following requirements:

- a) a close involvement with the WR?NCCC for a minimum period of three (3) years either as an WR/NCCC member or a legal member of the immediate family of a WR/NCCC member—child or grandchild.
- b) a high school diploma or the anticipation of a high school diploma before the time that the scholarship is to be awarded. A copy of the diploma must be provided before an award can be presented.
- c) college students must submit a copy of their college transcripts.
- d) an academic standing in high school in the upper third of the high school graduating class.
- e) a record of involvement in some extra curricular activities in high school or college.
- f) a letter of acceptance from the institution for which the scholarship is to be awarded.
- g) a brief 300 word essay included with the application outlining the applicant's reasons for wanting the scholarship and the applicant's career goals.
- h) Three letters of recommendation from persons who are qualified to evaluate the applicant's potential. The "Recommendation for WR Scholarship" form is to be used when asking for the recommendations.

Although the WR Scholarship is an award of money which does not necessarily need to be repaid, it would be appreciated if the recipient would consider contributing to the WR Scholarship Fund in some future time following the completion of his/her education.
