

From the President...

If you're currently reading this article that means one of two things.

- 1. Part of your job description is to proofread the Corvette Club of Iowa newsletter for appropriate content, and thus having to do so by necessity.
- 2. Or you've just returned from vacation and are now staring at your screen searching for something to hold off just a bit more time before returning to the daily grind after the holiday season. All the while coming to the realization your next scheduled holiday is the last Monday in May, that as I write this is a crushing 136 days away!

At either rate, we are staring into the post-holiday abyss as we make our way through January and February, which until 452 BCE weren't even in the ancient Roman Calendar. Yep, you heard that right, before 452 BCE there were only 10 months on the calendar because January & February were considered dormant, both in terms of agriculture and making war. It was most referred to as a time of peace and cease. That meant March was our current January due to the March Equinox, which like all equinoxes, is characterized by having an almost exact amount of daylight and night across most latitudes on Earth.

Circling back to January 2024, let's look over some fun facts about this month. With the solstice having come and gone, in the Northern Hemisphere, the days are starting to get longer as we look forward to the daylights' re-emergence. In fact, on January 3, 2024, earth reached its perihelion, the point in the planet's orbit where it's closest to the sun. A mere 92,955,807 miles away from our bright star. If you suffer from Heliophobia, you might want to consider some sunblock just as a precaution to set your mind at ease.

Another fun astronomic factoid is that the full moon in January is referred to as the Wolf Moon. In 2024, the wolf will be howling (peaking) on January 25, at 11:54 pm central time. It should be visible rising from the horizon around sunset that evening and barring any unforeseen weather that would shield it from our view be magnificent.

January also comes packed with several unique observances including one for spinners called Distaff's Day which also has a counterpart celebration called Plough Day. Distaff's Day celebrates the efforts and work of women returning to work at their spinning wheel, while Plough Day refers to the day when the men would return to working the fields after the plows were blessed to begin the planting season. These were both celebrated early in January shortly after Christmas break when everyone returned to work after the holiday break. Legend has it that young lads being mischievous used to set fire to the flax of the wool spinners where in return the women would douse them and any fire over their heads with water from a bucket. Just what they must have thought would be a little fun for an otherwise peaceful transition back to work after a long holiday.

What does all of this have to do with us as Corvette owners, not a lot outside of many of us having our cars stored away until spring. I don't know many of you who keep a certain calendar for storing your cars, but the first day of Spring this year will be March 19. Probably a little early yet to bring out the cars, but I try to be optimistic about it. Here's to hoping you all can refocus and have a safe and happy 2024! And as a reminder, if you wait until Memorial Day to bring your Corvette out of a winter cocoon, depending on when you read this, it is only 136 days away...
