Officer Reports

From the President...

This is our story...

Everyone has a story. Maybe something they did as a child, something they did in high school or college, their work, or in their everyday life. In last month's letter, I talked about the relationships we build in clubs such as ours, some staying acquaintances and others developing into what we always hope will be lifelong friends. We develop these friendships through learning about each other, so this month I'm going to take some time to tell everyone some things about myself.

I was born in Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, and my parents had one of the 1880s two-story brick commercial buildings in Marquette, Iowa, where I lived until going to college at Iowa State University (GO CYCLONES!) It was great growing up in a river town in NE Iowa, and I still miss spending time on the Mississippi River. After college, I needed to put food on the table and started working at an engineering firm in Ames in their front office. After a couple of months, I was approached by one of the staff who told me they were thinking about developing a right-of-way department and asked if I would be interested. It would get me out of the front office and mean more money, so of course I was interested. I did not expect that it would lead me to build our own company and what so far is a 34year career. While in high school, Laurie and I met through a relative of a friend of mine, about 42 years ago. Two kids through college at Iowa State (again, GO CYCLONES), and Laurie and I are still waiting for grandchildren.

Now on to the topic closer to our Corvette Club's purpose, the cars we have owned. My first car at 16 years old was a 1969 Chevrolet Impala. I was always impressed with that 350 under the hood, bearing the Tonawanda sticker. From there, one Pontiac, one Mercury, one Dodge, two Toyotas, and the rest were all Chevrolet. I may not have a perfect count, but where I have owned multiple auto models; I have had three Chevrolet pickups, five Camaros (two RS, one Berlinetta, one 2SS/RS, and one Z-28), four Corvettes (two Stingrays, two Grand Sports), two Impalas, one Chevelle, and a variety of other models. I guess this all came from growing up in a Chevrolet

family. My first memories of driving were with a brother-in-law who would have me sit on his lap in his 1967 RS Camaro and steer while he ran the gas, the brakes, the clutch and the shifter. I guess steering it out in the country may not have truly been classified as driving, but it was close enough for me. I attribute this to my passion for Camaros. When I was old enough to truly drive my parents' cars, they had a 1974 Nova, and what may have been a 1977 two-door Impala, a beauty with metallic maroon paint and a white vinyl top. Even though I put that car into a ditch which led to some paint being scratched by a barbed wire fence, and some time at the body shop for some paint touchup, I would love to have that car today. Unfortunately tracking it down now would be close to impossible, if it has even survived.

My story on the first Corvette in the McCracken household started in 2016 on an unseasonably warm December Saturday when Laurie and I had decided to break our 2010 Camaro out of the garage for a drive. We went south and out of curiosity, like I had done a number of times, I drove through Karl's lot where they had a few different Corvettes outside on display. I had purchased a few vehicles from one particular salesperson, whom I hunted down and asked him about taking one for a drive. I don't think I had planned on buying one, I was just curious, or so I thought. Even though he had sold me cars before, it may have been Karl's policy to not let someone drive a Corvette without a salesperson. I took the car for a short spin with him in the passenger seat, and I couldn't stop smiling. I was hooked! A few days later there was a 2016 Stingray in our garage.

Two other interesting tidbits about our Corvette ownership: When we were purchasing our 2017 Grand Sport, our dealer wanted to wait to do the paperwork until some sales promotions were available. They had picked our car up from another dealer in Wisconsin. Rather than store it on their lot, they backed an enclosed trailer up to our garage and unloaded it (again in the winter). For a week or so, that car was stored in there, and I didn't own it. Almost everyone has probably heard the story of the one-inch crack totaling that car. If not, I'm sure it is still available on the internet. I hope this gives you some enjoyment and a little history of our lives and our cars.
