

I had the honor of driving Denny's C8 for a few events on Saturday. Many of you have asked what I thought, and WOW! The technology in the new cars is just unthinkable. I wanted to describe the drive as easy as a go-kart but the car stuck so much better than a go-kart. The other question many have asked me is if I will be putting my order in for a C8 now. answer is no. While the car was incredible and made me look and feel like one bad-mam-ajam-a, I still like the challenge of feeling and driving the car on the track. Each generation of the Corvette is so unique and cool in its own way. Here is how I would describe the 3 generations I have had the privilege to race they can all fly in their own way:

- C3 The Dinosaur, a Pterodactyl If you want to feel every turn, cone, imperfection of the pavement lol, and want a full work out, all while the feeling of nostalgia and bad-a\$\$-ery overcomes your senses, this is the ride for you.
- C5 The Woodpecker A more relevant bird/racecar in today's world. The woodpecker represents horsepower, it will get up and go with few rapid wing beats followed by a quick glide. #### Governor's Message...

#### Hi, everyone:

It's summertime and I hope you are all enjoying the season. Many of us are vacationing this month, myself included. I hope your travels are safe and fun!

Well, our second and final autocross of the year was run at the Chariton Airport June 26-27, 2021. I'm sure that most of you have heard the event did not end well, with one of our members being injured by a competitor who lost control of his Corvette during one of his runs. The injured club member was on duty as a corner worker and was returning to their position after setting up a downed cone, when the competitor tried to jog to the left to go through a gate. The racer lost control as the back of the car spun around, slid sideways off the track and through the grass, striking the worker, who was transported by ambulance to a local hospital, then flown by helicopter ambulance to Mercy Medical Center in Des The injuries the worker sustained could be referred to as serious and a long recovery is expected. Please keep the victim and their spouse in your thoughts and prayers during the hospitalization and rehabilitation period.

Following the logistical difficulties we faced at the Ankeny low-speed autocross in May and the awful personal injury incident we had last month in Chariton, I think it's time we review our competition program. Some questions I think we need to answer are the following: Do we want to continue to host competition events? If so, what is the number of competitors that we can comfortably handle? Do we need new equipment to facilitate more efficient events? How can we make our events a great value for

competitors? And, most importantly, is there anything we can do to make our events safer for workers and drivers? I will be suggesting a committee to review our practices prior to the 2022 competition season.

While vacationing in Okoboji last weekend, we visited Okoboji Classic Cars. We should arrange a club trip up there some weekend to tour the place. They are a little short on cars right now but they've still got 40-50 of them. The walls consist of wall-to-wall murals. Their website describes the museum this way: "This one-of-a-kind facility houses a solo painted mural that is over 28,000 sq. feet, plus indoor diorama scenes. All of the artwork was painted

by resident artist Jack Rees. This magnificent scenery brings our visitors back to Spencer's Grand Avenue where they can browse vintage storefronts. Or, they can take a relaxing stroll thru old Arnolds Park, enjoying the evening scenes of West Lake Okoboji. The Classic Roof Garden, Fun House, and even the Peacock are brought back to life. For a relaxing evening, sit by the 200-foot sunset over West Okoboji Lake's Smith's Bay."
