

Most of us have put away the summer clothes and tucked away our Corvettes for the winter, anticipating a few months of bitter cold and snow. This is also the time of year that most of us put up our outside lights, decorate the inside of the house and prepare for Christmas. Usually, at some point during the Christmas season, I take a little bit of time to reflect on the true meaning of the season, and I think about past Christmases I have spent with family.

The first Christmas I can remember was probably about 1958. I was pretty young, but I can still see my little sister and me gathered together with Dad and Mom, along with Grandma and Grandpa on Christmas Eve in our little rented home in Marshalltown. The highlight of the evening for me was opening a package that contained a toy tow truck. This wasn't a molded plastic toy that would break if you were too rough with it, but a real metal wrecker with a boom that had string connected to a crank in the back of the truck with a hook on the other end. It was white and it had a decal on the door. I could roll it around the house on its four wheels or take it outside in the dirt to haul my broken toy trucks around. But the BEST part was that it had a battery pack with two flashing red lights affixed to the top that fit in the back of the truck just in front of the boom. It was just like the real thing. I loved that truck.

As I got older, I recall it was a tradition to go to Grandma and Grandpa's house on Christmas Eve (after begging our parents most of the day to open "just one" of our presents early). All of my aunts, uncles and cousins gathered there. The adults spent their time in the kitchen (Looking back, I suspect they may have been adding a little something to their eggnog), while the kids would play and snack on Christmas cookies, nuts and snacks until it was time to open some gifts. My recollection is that we drew names previously, and when we got together at Grandma's, we gave a present to whomever's name we drew. The party ended shortly after gifts were exchanged and we all went home. For most of my childhood, my immediate family and I went to bed and anxiously woke up early on Christmas morning to open our presents. Before noon, we went back to Grandma's for dinner. Grandma was a great cook and the food at Christmas dinner was always wonderful. The best part, though, was creating the memories with family that I still carry with me today. Turnout for that dinner varied through the years, as kids grew up, started their own families, and got together differently for the holidays.

My parents, grandparents, and many of my aunts and uncles all passed away through the years, making those memories all the more special. I became one of the kids who grew up and had his own family. As a parent, my wife, Deb, and I tried our best to make happy Christmas memories for our kids. I recall 1984, when my son, Brian, was just a month old. In the middle of the night when he woke up and was hungry or fussy, I remember him lying in his little bassinet staring at the lights on the Christmas tree. He seemed absolutely fascinated by those colorful little lights. As the kids got older, it became more difficult to try and figure out just the right gift for my wife and the kids. My daughter, Kari, was always thrilled with anything we got her. Brian, on the other hand could be a bit picky. One year, however, my Deb looked all over the state for a die-cast John Deere four-wheel drive tractor with dual wheels. She finally found one in Waterloo, and bought it. That was a huge hit with Brian that year. He still has that tractor, although now his son is its operator and caretaker. It wouldn't surprise me if that was still around for the next generation of Foster boys. Throughout my married life, Christmas always included a trip to Minnesota to spend

some time with Deb's family, there. You know, it always seemed colder in Minnesota. Brrrr.

As most of my fellow club members do, I now have grandchildren. They are still young enough to be fun at Christmas time. I love any time I can get with them, and I truly enjoy having them around during the holidays. Of course, right now, it's just imperative for me to find the perfect gifts for each child and keep the spending equitable for all of them. I always spend more than I think I'm going to, but I usually find gifts to make them happy and keep them smiling. One thing I always seem to remember is that it's not the gifts that they'll remember. It's the memories we create with them. I hope they will cherish the memories we've made together, forever. That's the best gift I could ever give!

My hope is that I've triggered you to think of some happy Christmas memories from your past and that you will make some more with your family this holiday season.

Jeff asked if we had any guests or new members in attendance but there were none. He addressed the membership and offered some clarification regarding MotorsportReg adoption. The encryption and security of the platform is equal to or greater than that of banks, due to the card processing capabilities housed in the site. The Board's intent is to create a more secure and streamlined process for everyone.

Secretary Dave McChesney reported that the October 18th general meeting minutes are published in *Sportsmate* and asked if anyone had comments. There was no discussion and Paul Wyman motioned to approve the minutes as published. Dave Brown seconded and the motion passed. Laurie McCracken submitted the Treasurer's report with updated balances in club accounts. Many membership renewals are

coming in. Renewals that are done on MotorsportReg appear as “Hagerty” on the bank statement. Trailer insurance was renewed.

Vice President/Social Director Carrol McCracken reported the fall color run was 922 miles over 3 days and fun was had by all. 5 cars and 8 people participated. The District Venue at Prairie Trail has been chosen for the holiday party. It is a quality venue with plenty of space and a cash bar will be available. Dave Brown motioned to approve the venue with attendees paying \$20 each for their meal and the club covering the meal cost above that along with the room rental fee. Jay Hommer seconded and the motion passed.

Governor Gary Foster was present and reported on the recent Governors meeting. The 2023 NCCC Convention will be in Bowling Green, Kentucky. Host hotel is a Holiday Inn. Welcome party is Sunday and there will be a concours, rallye and all sorts of racing and other events throughout the week. 2024 Convention will be held in Joplin, Missouri and for 2025 they are looking at holding Convention in the Black Hills

in conjunction with the Black Hills Classic. The plan for CCI competition in 2023 is to host two autocross events, 1 car show and 1 rallye. Competition Director Denny Luther had nothing to report.

Editor Dave Howard thanked Wayne Nikolish for all the photos he submitted for this month’s *Sportsmate*. Points Director Janelle Ohmstede was absent and submitted no report. Membership Director Mike Golightly reported he is personally going to contact members who have not renewed to make sure all opportunities for retention are available. Social Media director Pat Whalen was absent and there was no report. New Business: none. Old Business: none. Buy & Sell: none.


Events
